Why these communities

It was important to visit as many communities as possible given the short time period.

Our choices reflected the major communities and the geographic coverage of the counties.

October turned out to be the designated month to have the forums in both counties.

In the time available, ten community forums occurred.

The forums had from 7 to 24 attendees for a total of 157 attendees.

What is Broadband?

Broadband is advanced communications systems capable of providing high-speed transmission of services such as data, voice & video over the Internet.

Transmission is provided by a wide range of technologies, including digital subscriber line (DSL), fiber optic cable, coaxial cable, wireless & satellite.

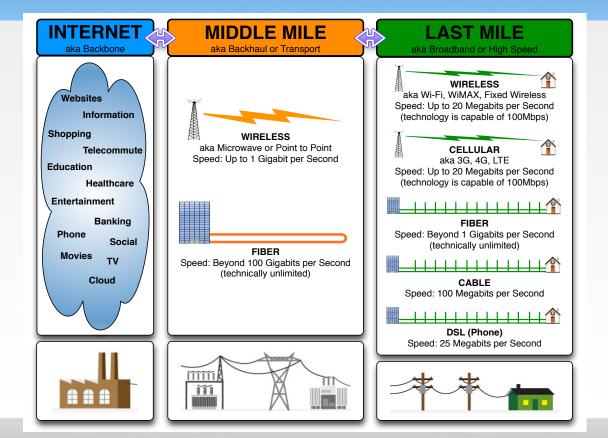
FCC definition in 2010: 4 Mbps download and 1 Mbps upload

Attendees at the Community Forums Knew

What we found out?

- **# High-speed Internet does create jobs.**

- **B** Demand for Broadband is outpacing service.
- **There are still locations of NO Internet service.**
- **Residents very knowledgeable and hungry for service.**
- **™** No 1-800-Broadband.



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How the Communities helped

- Took the online Community and Business Surveys.
- Took the WSBO Internet Speedtest.
- Spread the word about this effort.
- Mapped their connection.
- Completed 280 surveys and told their stories.
- Latest WSBO comments are coming from Klickitat and Skamania Counties.







One very compelling story

I became eligible to have high-speed wireless internet at my home about 2 years ago. Before that, we had no option but dial-up which was way too slow to really do much.

Having internet at my home became a CRITICAL resource when I was laid off from my full-time job. I was able to job search, network and conduct educational research without having to drive 50 miles (round trip) to do this work. This allowed me to save money and even pick up some paid work that I could do from home. I was more likely to look for work, gain new knowledge, make connections and find opportunities to volunteer or job shadow because of the having the internet in my home.

I believe it is crucial to provide rural areas with adequate internet availability. I now have a full time job am an advocate for improved internet services to our community because of the doors it can open. THANK YOU for working on this issue. I feel very lucky that I was a beneficiary of this work.

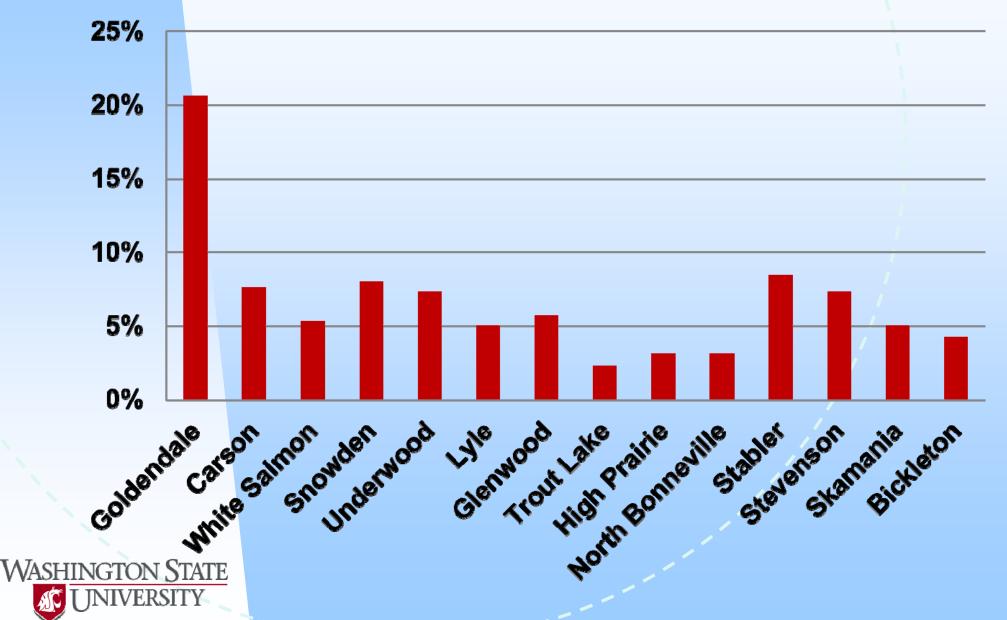
Survey Demographics

- 74% Two adults in households



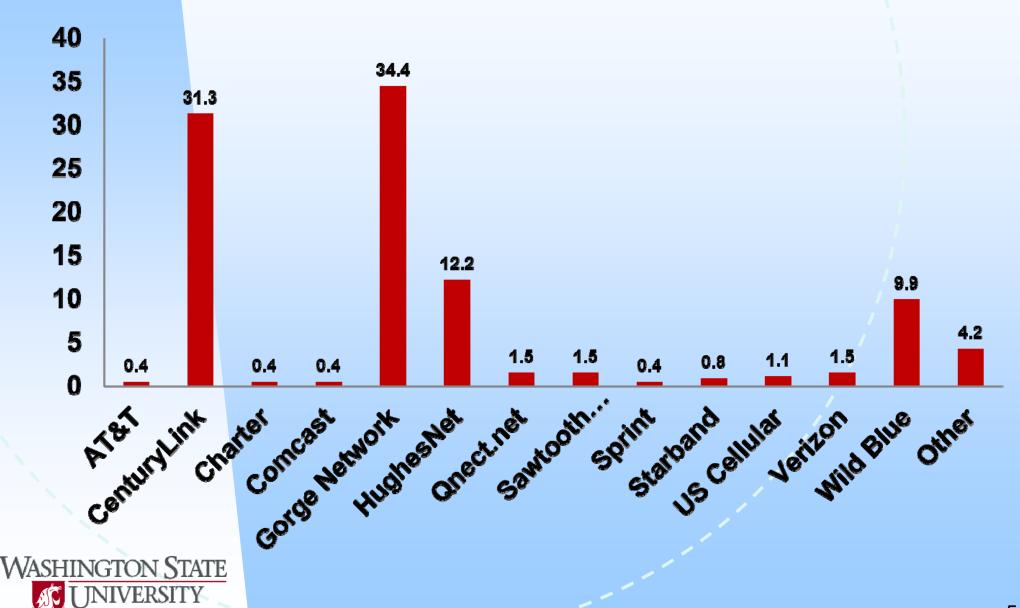


Responses By Community



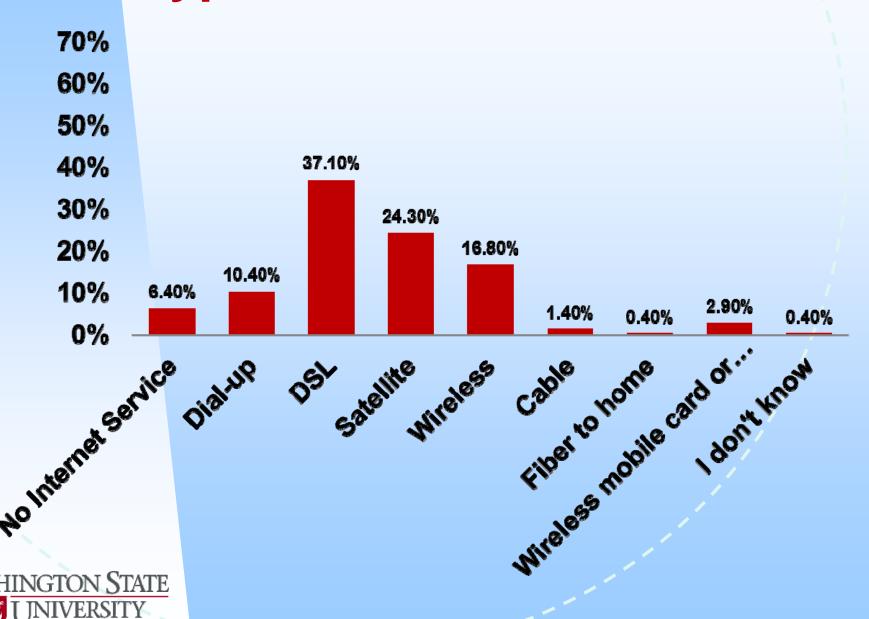
World Class. Face to Face.

Home Internet Service Satisfaction

- Almost half rated price, reliability, and support as either very satisfied or somewhat satisfied
- Over half indicated they were either very dissatisfied or somewhat dissatisfied with their speed
- Overall Satisfaction Equally split





Mobile Internet Service Satisfaction

- Responds were equally split on price, speed, and support
- On reliability:
 - 48% Very Satisfied or Somewhat Satisfied
 - 37% Somewhat Dissatisfied or Very Dissatisfied
- Overall Satisfaction Equally split





Top Daily Home Internet Uses

- News/weather information 62%
- Social media/networking 57%
- General information/research 46%
- Entertainment 42%





Work Related Home Internet Use

One or more days per week:

- Telework 43%
- Home-based business 39%

A significant number of comments indicated people are working out of their homes AND more would with improved broadband.





Public Computer Centers

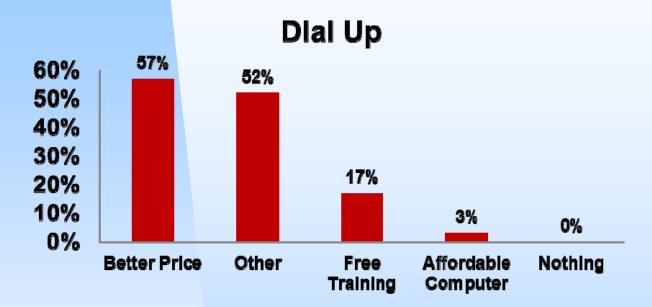
Only 11% reported weekly or more use of computers at public facilities but....

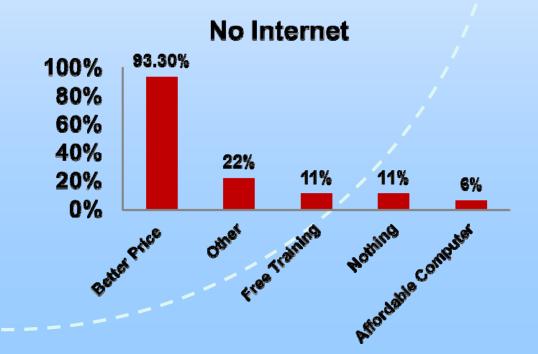


- 87% Strongly agree or agree about the importance of free public Internet "hotspots"
- 62% Strongly agree or agree they are more likely to frequent businesses with free Internet "hotspots"

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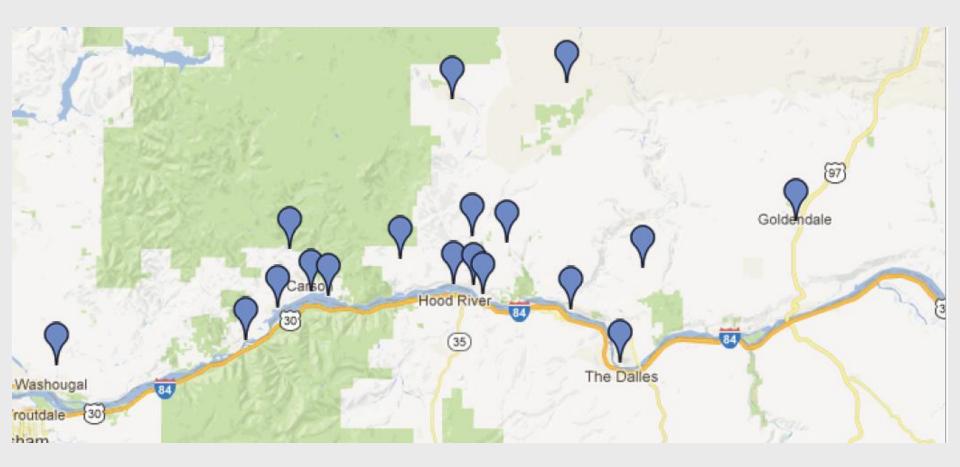
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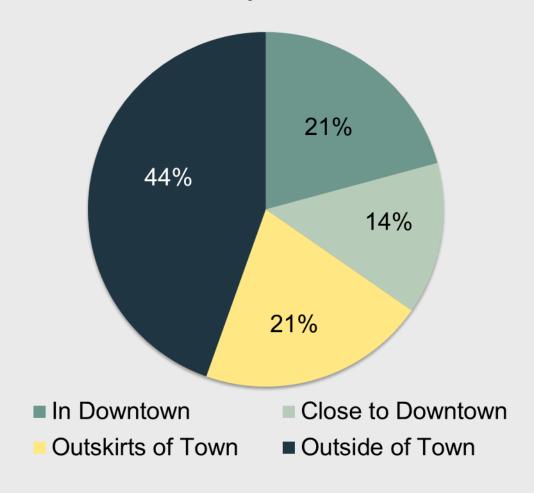

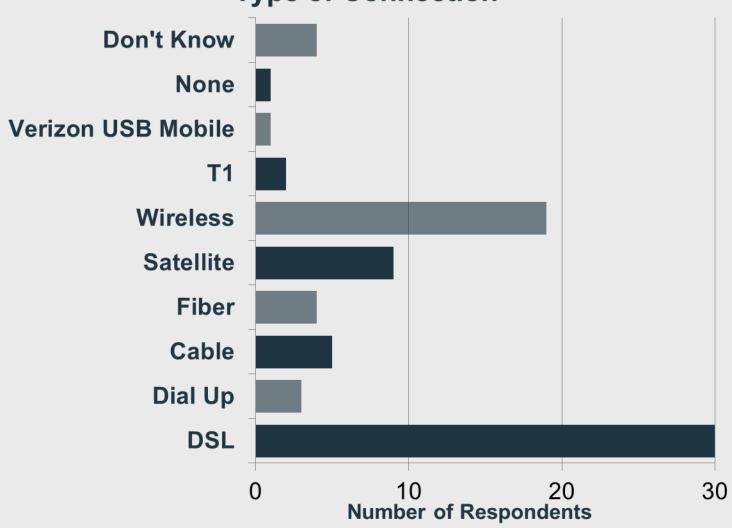
Where around town is your business located?





Internet Service



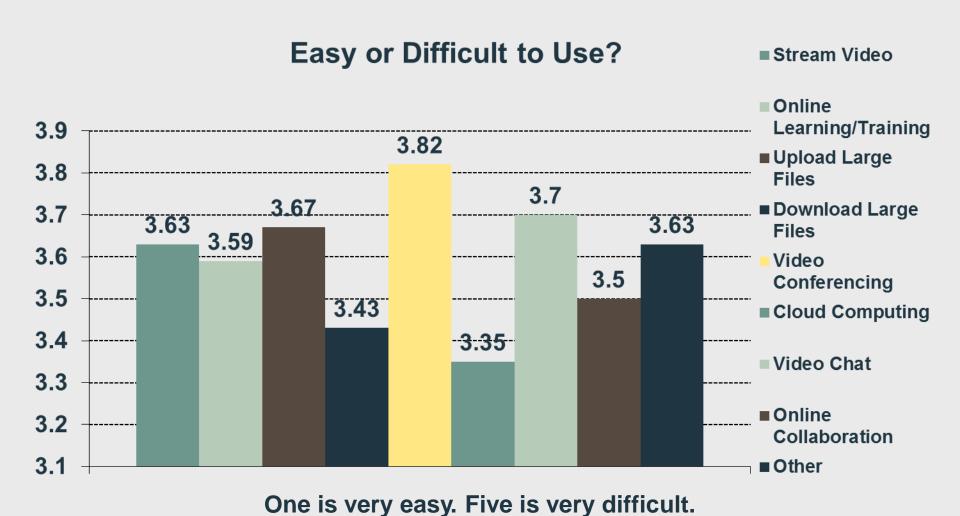


How satisfied are you with your current internet service?

- More were satisfied or very satisfied with their customer service than dissatisfied.
- Overall satisfaction leans toward dissatisfied but about 33% are neutral.

"Time is money. Faster is better."

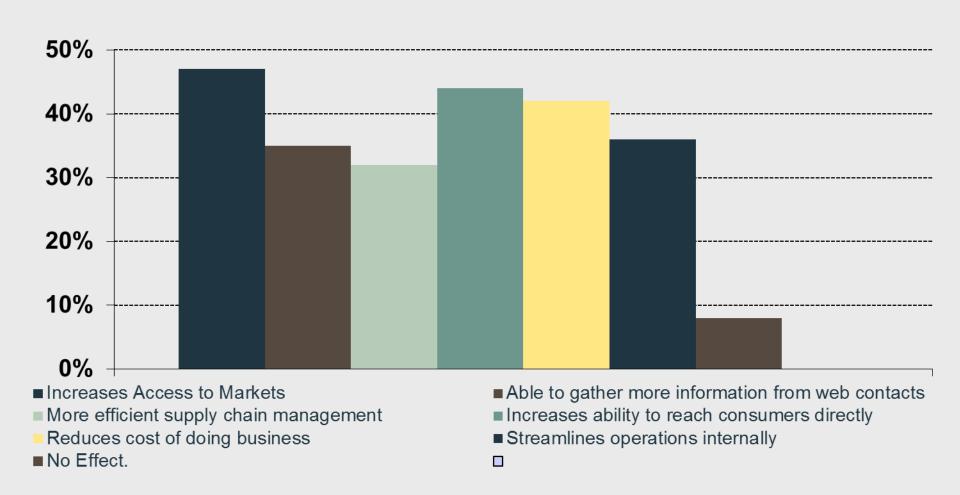
"Better service would bring in more customers."
